- a) The result of the QCA and YouGov bi-annual Small and Mid-Cap Sentiment survey was published towards the end of 2021. The survey provides insight into how small and mid-sized quoted companies have responded to 2021 and what their outlook for the year ahead is. For the first time in the history of the survey, bank debt overtook equity as the most attractive form of financing for small and mid-sized quoted companies. - b) The QCA and UHY Hacker Young published its annual AIM Good Governance Review in December 2021. The report analyses the governance disclosures of 50 AIM-quoted companies across three specific areas: board performance evaluations; ESG; and the post-Covid recovery. - c) The QCA and Peel Hunt Small and Mid-Cap Investor Survey for 2022 will be published on 25 January 2022.
